You are part of gas pipeline safety.

Natural gas is a trusted source of energy that's reliable and efficient. At times you may notice a yellow gas pipeline marker. It identifies the gas company with their name and phone number. But nearly all pipelines are buried underground. Like other forms of energy, natural gas needs to be handled properly.

Our industry has an excellent safety record. Still, unexpected incidents – particularly damage from third-party excavation – can cause a gas leak and a potentially serious hazard. Please be alert to the signs of a gas leak and help keep our communities safe.

By smell, sight and sound.

Most natural gas has an odor added to it that is harmless but very distinct. If you **smell** gas; and/or **see** a white cloudy mist, bubbles in standing water or blowing dust; and/or **hear** a hissing, roaring or whistling sound, it could be a gas leak.

What to do if you think there's a gas leak:

- Move to a safe area.
- Do not smoke or do anything to create a flame.
- Do not turn on light switches or electrical equipment.
- Call National Grid immediately at 1-800-640-1595.
- Don't assume someone else will call. Please call us.
- Tell us the exact location, including cross streets.
- Tell us if you noticed construction or digging activities in the area.

Pipelines on private property.

Natural gas pipelines run under public streets and may also be found under private property. For safety reasons, *right-of-way* laws can give pipeline owners the right to restrict certain activities near pipelines. Maps of rightof-way are filed with local municipalities.

Call before you dig.

Even minor damage to a pipeline can cause a gas leak. Both homeowners and professionals in Rhode Island must call the *Dig Safe®* center three business days before starting any excavation project. That number is **811** or **1-888-344-7233**. Wait for the area to be marked – indicating underground facilities – at no charge to you, so you can dig with care and avoid underground utility lines. Failure to comply with this law can risk lives and is subject to large fines.

Safety is our top priority.

National Grid works with peer groups and state regulators on methods and programs to keep our natural gas distribution safe. We constantly invest in new technology for the design, construction, inspection and operation of our system. We coordinate with federal, state and local authorities. We train our field workers, and drill with emergency responders.

Natural gas energy is and will continue to be safe, reliable and affordable. We want to keep it that way. Help your community by using natural gas properly, being alert and calling *Dig Safe* before you dig. Help your community and be part of natural gas pipeline safety.

Our gas pipelines run underground and are protected against wind. But customers should be concerned about severe storms when structural damage to property could affect gas pipes and meters. Flooding may also affect gas equipment or appliances.

Unless advised by National Grid, do not shut off your natural gas. If you suspect a gas leak, by smell, sight and/or sound, call National Grid's gas emergency number at **1-800-640-1595**. Move to a safe area before you call.

Is someone stealing your natural gas?

Tampering with a natural gas meter is extremely dangerous. Stealing gas is illegal and drives up everyone's gas bill. If something about your gas meter doesn't look right, or you think someone is stealing natural gas, please call us at **1-800-870-1664**. All calls are kept strictly confidential.

Preventing heat stress.
